



Dear Applicant

The Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries as of April 1<sup>st</sup> 2005 introduced a new regime for the granting of concessions. The regime introduces a new application procedure that entails the following:

1. Obtain and complete application documentation – **FORM A. Sections A to D** **must be** completed by the applicant (attached).
2. Submit application to the Ministry for consideration. The process for smaller-value applications where the total estimated value of waivers is less than EC\$100,000 will be dealt with at the Ministry level; requests for larger-value concessions in excess of EC\$100,000 will be considered at the level of the Cabinet of Ministers. For smaller applications please allow four (4) weeks for consideration and delivery of a response. For larger applications allow eight (8) weeks for consideration and delivery of a response. Please note that these timeframes are indicative.
3. Upon granting of approval the recipient is obligated to submit annual declarations, on **FORM B** to the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries. These forms must be submitted on or before December 31<sup>st</sup> each year. This is necessary to ensure that the concessions are being towards the intended purpose. Failure to submit these declarations.

Attached is general information about the incentive regime, along with the relevant forms.

## **St. Lucia Agricultural Development Incentives Regime**

A framework to harmonize the granting of incentives to support agri-business development in all areas, including crops, livestock and fisheries, has been put in place commencing April 1<sup>st</sup> 2005. The framework sets out to standardize the criteria for qualification, the range of goods and services that may be subject to support, and to rationalize the administrative process by which persons or businesses apply for concessions.

**The following are the key features of the new regime:**

### **To provide an enabling environment for the development cooperatives and other NGO's**

All **legally registered** local enterprises will be eligible for concessions under the regime, however it provides for expanded accessibility for farmers and fishers **through** legally established cooperative groups or associations. This is in keeping with the basic premise that greater production efficiencies are realized with greater numbers, where resources can be pooled and benefits accruing to a broader segment of the community.

### **Qualification**

To access concessions basic qualification requirements are being put into place. All applicants will need to present a business plan that demonstrates viability of the enterprise. Persons already engaged in agri-business who are applying for new concessions or renewals, will need to provide evidence of prior business transactions.

However, for new enterprises, this requirement will be waived; evidence of access to financial resources to invest will be required. Another important pre-qualification will be access to land in the case of crop or livestock production. For agro-processing or other value-added product/service, evidence of access to appropriate facilities will be required.

### **Concessions available**

The regime will continue to make concessions available through partial or complete waiver of import duties, consumption and excise taxes on generic items used in production of primary or processed agricultural commodities. For example, waivers will be still applicable for goods vehicles, refrigerated trucks and farm equipment such as tractors. The same will apply to fertilizers, agro-chemicals, medications, safety gear and preparation tools and equipment.

The regime seeks to enhance adoption of technologies that will assist producers in meeting compliance for product standards based on Good Agricultural Practices (for example EUREP-GAP standards for bananas) and the application of environmentally sustainable practices.

In this regard concessions will be made available for procurement of improved plant and livestock varieties and associated tools and equipment including

irrigation infrastructure, energy saving devices etc. Similarly in the fisheries sector, the regime will maintain concessions on vessels and equipment.

### **Compatibility with WTO, CSME**

It must be noted that the level of support being offered through this new incentives regime is compliant with support measures allowed under the World Trade Organization Agreement on Agriculture (WTO-AoA), which is the benchmark that will guide trade between nations and certainly within the Caribbean Single Market and Economy. The prevailing policy for support to the agriculture sector is oriented towards enhancement of production efficiency in attempting to drive the cost of production down so that producers can take advantage of market opportunity.

### **Monitoring and evaluation**

A key and very important feature of the new regime will be obligations to be met by recipients of concessions. At the end of each year recipients will be required to submit declarations that provide evidence that the concession granted was used efficiently and for the specific purpose.

The declaration, which will be in a simple format, will be submitted to the Ministry of Agriculture. The Ministry in turn will use the data to monitor the relative impact of Government support measures on changes in growth within the various sub-sectors. The declaration will be a key policy support measure to gauge efficacy of Government policy and provide the basis to revise policy to suit changing circumstances. In this regard, failure to comply with reporting requirements could potentially result in withdrawal of the concession.

### **Administration**

Under the new regime, requests below a threshold value of EC\$100,000 (cost of waiver) will be subject to the consideration of an internal committee within the Ministry of Agriculture. Beyond this threshold it will be considered at Cabinet level, given the potential repercussions to revenue generation at the national level.

## Annex 1

### Business plan information requirements

It is noted that business plans will be required for larger agri-business developments, such as installation of processing plants or large-scale primary production systems. Requests for stand-alone items (such as vehicles, supplies) will normally not require that a business plan be developed. This is not a strict rule, however, the Ministry Review Committee (MRC) will/may inform an applicant if a business plan is required.

Business plans should be concise with emphasis placed on providing the following key pieces of information<sup>1</sup>. This is intended as a guide; the precise format of the business plan may vary.

#### (A) The Project

1. **Project description** – a paragraph that explains the nature of the project, location of the operation
2. **Project objectives** – the main outcomes expected with successful implementation of the project. These should include the forecast production output, markets, number of persons to be employed
3. **Current financing and/or investment to be made** – the total initial investment cost and the estimated monetary input into the project on an annual basis

#### (B) Technical data

1. **Production** – the estimated production output on an annual basis
2. **Process** – a brief description of how the commodity(ies) are to be produced including a description of the plant and machinery to be used.
3. **Raw material requirements** – a list of the material requirements for the operation of the enterprise

**(C) Quality and control standards** – a statement of the quality measures to be put in place to ensure quality control. An example of this is adherence to EUREP-GAP standards. The St. Lucia Bureau of Standards should be consulted for further information on standards that may exist related to the particular commodity(ies) targeted for production.

**(D) Environment issues** – a statement of measures to be installed to safeguard potential for environmental degradation. Particular concerns are typically associated with discharge of waster from livestock production units into watercourses and cultivation of particular crops on steep slopes.

**(E) Supplies storage** – a statement on the capacity to stock-pile materials essential to production. Describe the nature of facilities that may be used.

**(F) Record keeping systems to be installed and/or currently in place** – a statement on the format of record-keeping that has been adopted or to be adopted

**(G) Marketing**

1. **Price** – provide an indication on the projected cost for the commodity(ies) to be produced
2. **Promotion and distribution** – brief statement on the plan to market and distribute the commodity(ies). This should include prospective buyers, locally, regionally and internationally

**(H) Human resources** – a statement on the numbers to be employed and in what positions (it may be necessary to briefly describe the roles of those persons)

**(I) Financial strategy**

1. **Financing** - identify the sources of financing
2. **Costing** – the project cost to include a draw-down schedule
3. **Assumptions** – any assumptions that are being made that are required for successful implementation of the project
4. **Constraints** – any limitations that may hinder successful project implementation
5. **Statements** – projected data in the case of new enterprises and actual data for existing enterprises
  - a. Income sheet
  - b. Balance sheet
  - c. Cash flow statement
